Health, Retirement, and Long-Term Analysis Division

The Congressional Budget Office is a small nonpartisan agency that provides economic, policy, and budgetary analysis to the Congress. The Health, Retirement, and Long-Term Analysis Division (HRLD) is seeking a health economist to contribute to a variety of projects, analyses, and modeling in the health area.

HRLD's recently completed work includes multiple analyses of the effects of the Affordable Care Act (ACA)—or changes to its provisions—on insurance coverage and federal health care spending, an analysis of the budgetary and economic effects of repealing the ACA, long-term projections of spending in federal healthcare programs, an analysis of competition and costs in the Medicare drug benefit, and a study of illustrative options for designing a "premium support" system for Medicare. Ongoing work includes further analyses related to the ACA and studies on a broad range of topics, including drivers of private insurance premiums, factors affecting the supply and prices of medical care, and the effects of policies to address obesity on healthcare spending.

The successful candidate will contribute to the full range of the division's responsibilities, which include preparing CBO reports and testimonies, developing new studies, and designing and improving state-of-the-art analytical models that underlie those CBO products. In addition to producing CBO studies and reports, analysts are encouraged to turn projects or independent research into CBO working papers or outside publications.

Qualifications

Applicants must have a Ph.D. in economics or a related discipline, and prior experience in health policy analysis. Applicants should also have a strong quantitative background, excellent writing skills, and a desire to work as part of a team on issues of current legislative interest to the Congress.
